(Mark 3:13-19)

I. Twelve disciples of Jesus

disciples and asks the children to recall the names:

- ▶ Simon Peter ▶ James ▶ John ▶ Andrew ▶ Philip ▶ Bartholomew
- ▶ Matthew ▶ Thomas ▶ James son of Alphaeus ▶ Thaddaeus ▶ Simon the Zealot ▶ Judas Iscariot

(b). Every disciple of Christ needs:

- ▶ To not sacrifice Jesus for anything
- ▶ To be a honest

II. Lesson From Judas Iscariot

1. Judas is universally known as the betrayer of Jesus Luke 22:48

(a). Amongst the first 12 disciples, Judas is publicly known as the betrayer of Jesus. He betrayed Jesus by selling Him to a group of people who hated Him with 30 pieces of silver Matt. 27:3

(b). If someone acts as a betrayer, this means that he/she willingly hurts somebody who is used to be close to him/her for the sake of seeking own's benefits

(c) In other word, when someone acts a betrayer, he/she is performing a disloyal act to his/her close friend(s)/relative(s)

(d). Our Lord Jesus has been showing that He is always good to us. If you are not a betrayer, you would then:

- (i). Love Him in all times
- (ii). Always obey His Word
- (iii). Always be closed to Him and never leave Him
- (iv). Always glorify His Name through your good and faithful deeds and attitudes

2. Judas was dishonest in God's sights John 12:6

(a). The fact that Judas was a thief, it clearly indicates that he is a dishonest person

(b). As a faithful follower of Christ, we should be honest to God and others Matt. 19:18

(c). We would be similarly dishonest to God, if we were dishonest to other people

(d). Being honest means that we are not hiding the truth about something, instead, we are always telling the truth and never stealing or cheating
